



Join Us for an Inaugural Meeting of the Call for Justice Legal Liaison Program—Greater MN!

Call for Justice, LLC works to connect low-income people with civil legal resources. We are a “hub” of information related to the civil legal system and we broadcast about new programs aimed at connecting people in legal need with attorneys and legal resources. (For example, did you know that it’s possible for a low income person to obtain email legal advice from an attorney anywhere in Minnesota at any time of the day? Or, did you know that it’s possible to obtain a legal resource referral 24/7/365 and talk to a real person in doing so?)

One of our initiatives is the “Legal Liaison Program” (LLP), which connects nonprofit social service providers and nonprofit legal providers in an effort to improve communications about legal needs/resources and as a way to foster collaborations. Many times, those collaborations help increase civil legal access for low-income people.

In the Twin Cities, our LLP involves approximately 55 social service and legal providers. Our “Legal Liaisons” meet three times a year for programming and speed networking. In particular, Legal Liaisons love speed networking since it gives them exposure to programs/people they otherwise would not meet. Legal Liaisons are encouraged to use the networking as a means to set future coffees, lunches or drink dates in order to brainstorm and think of possible collaborations. Because we’ve had numerous requests to expand the LLP to greater Minnesota, the Call for Justice Board of Directors has authorized a pilot project to reach out to southeastern Minnesota.
