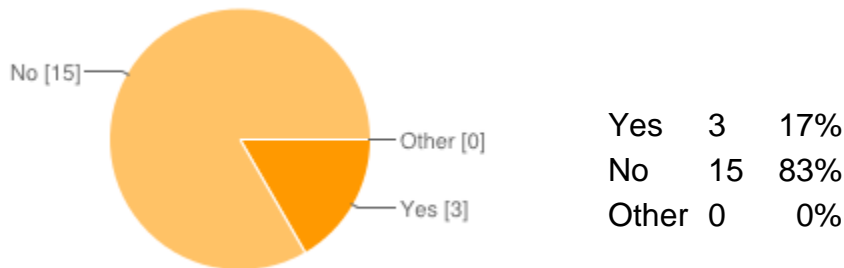

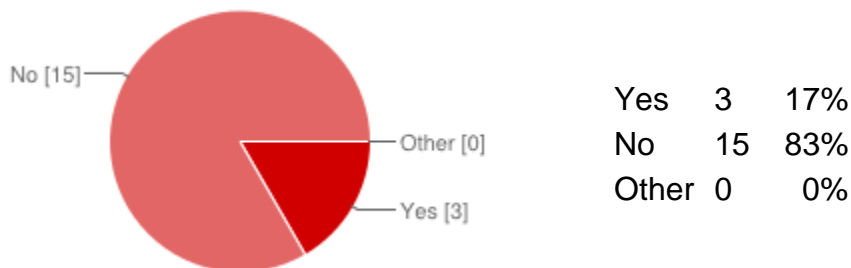

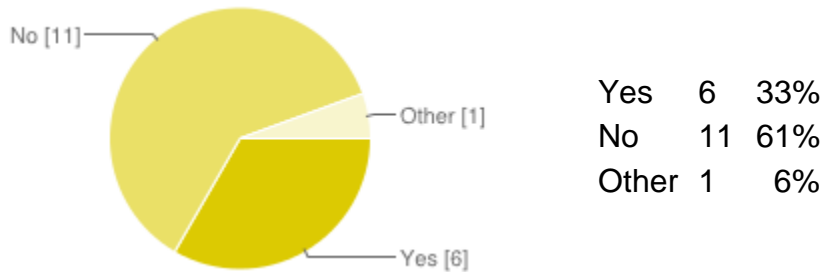
2. Have you ever referred a client to United Way 2-1-1 for a legal referral?



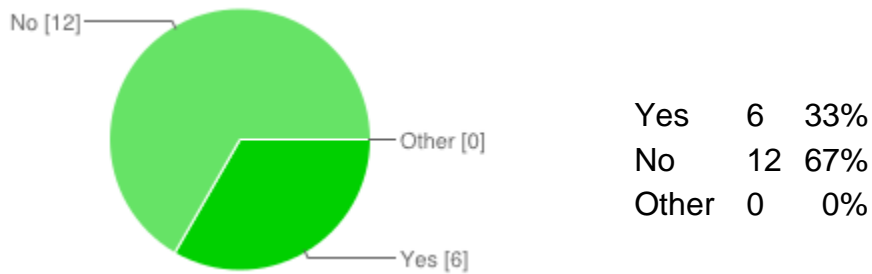
3. Have you ever visited the 2-1-1 website?



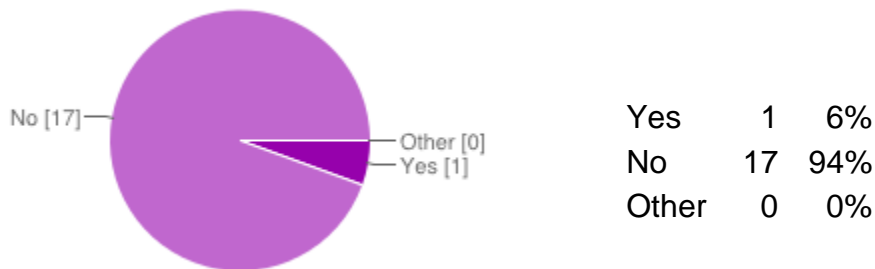
4. Have you ever referred a client/constituent/patron to LawHelpMN.org?



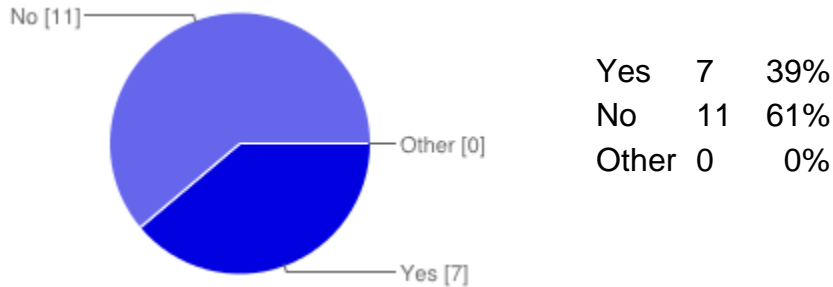
5. Did you know that free legal advice may be available to eligible persons at Minnesota Legal Advice Online (MLAO)?



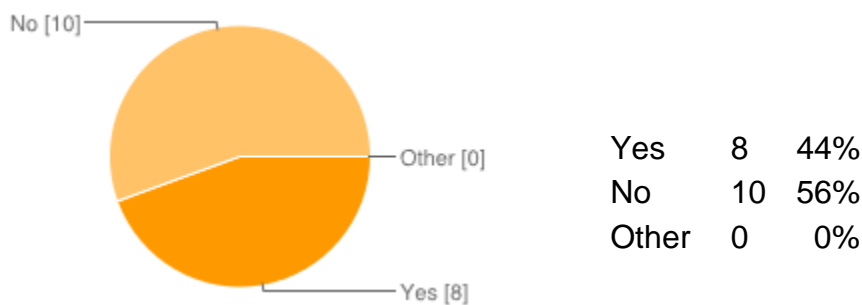
6. Have you ever referred a client to the legal resource videos on the C4J website?



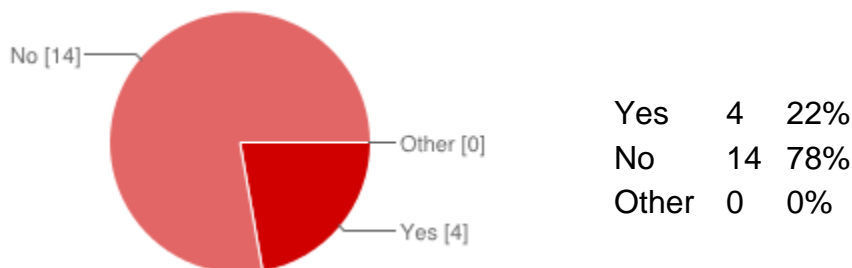
7. Are you familiar with the services offered by the MN Court Self-Help Centers?



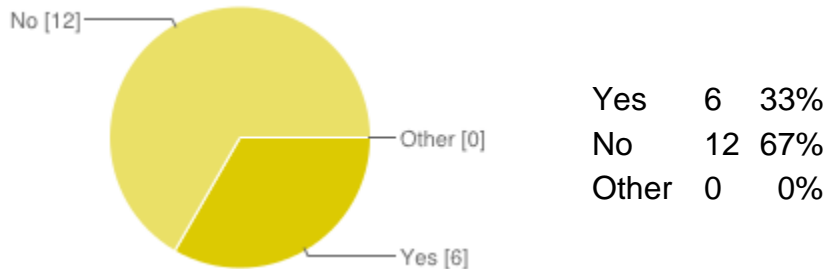

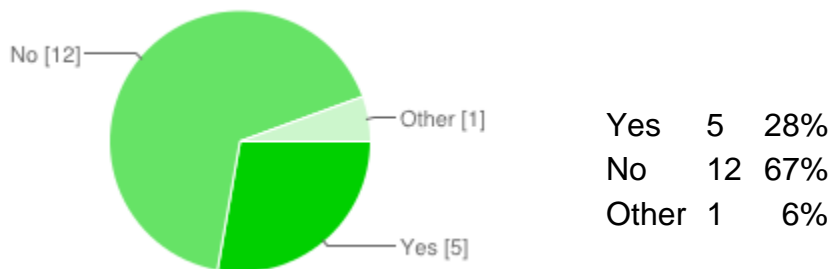
9. Did you know that the MN Courts Self-Help Center can review completed court forms that are available on the MN Judicial Branch website (www.mncourts.gov/forms)?

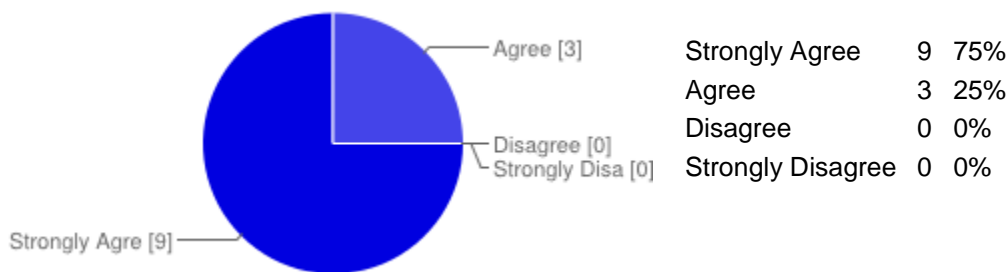

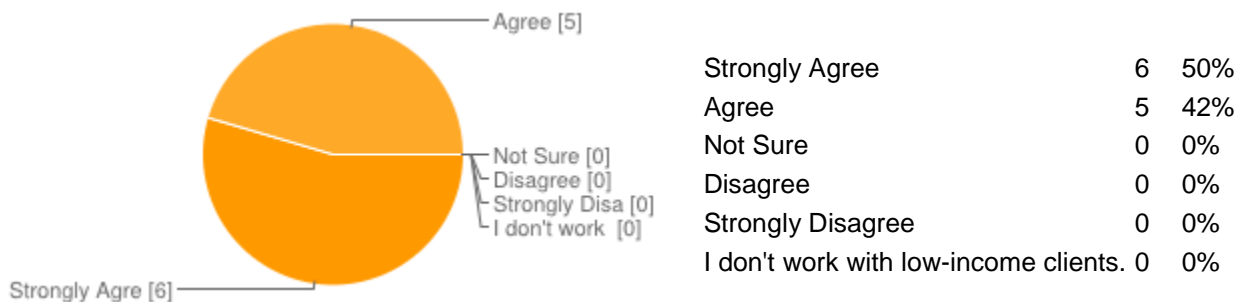

Post-Event Survey Summary

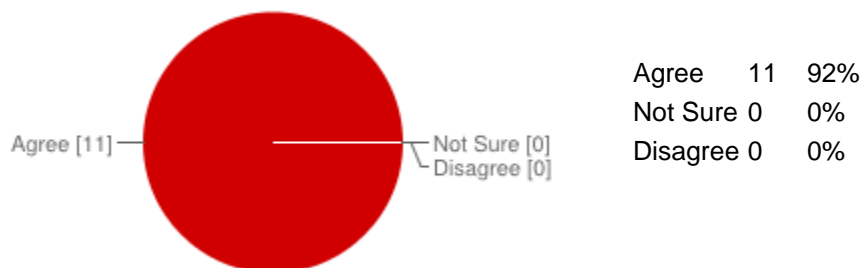
By attending the Call for Justice event, I gained useful new information, knowledge and/or insights.



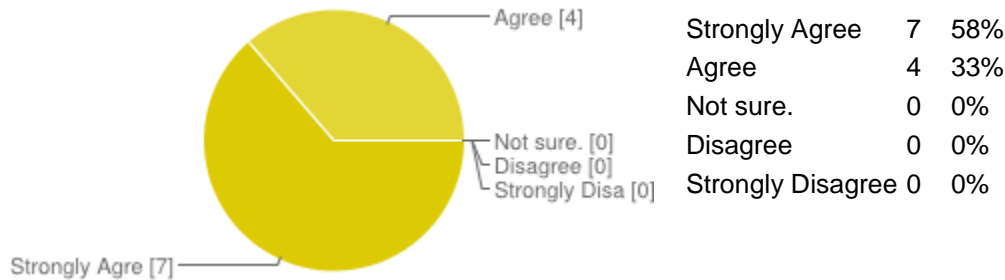
I will use what I learned at this event in my work with low-income people.



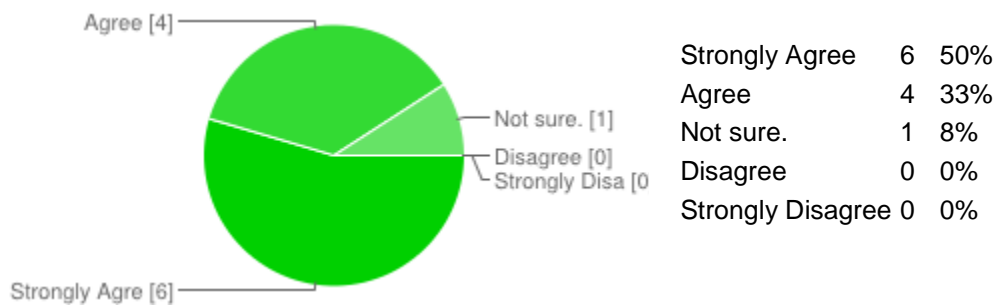
I plan to share what I learned with others in my organization who work with low-income people.
